She is a former North Penn teacher who directed shows at NP for years for both typical and Special Needs students. Cindy's contributions to Harmony Theater were significant during our time of transition from Gwynedd Mercy College to our own entity. She is now a member-at-large on our Board.

The scholarship is given to ANY Harmony actor based on a lottery. Once a winner is selected, they cannot win again until all members have had a chance.

The scholarship is for \$100 deducted from the winner's tuition.

A drawing will be done each year at the spring performance for the following Harmony Theater season. This year's winning participant was Katie Kneeland.

With all that experience we can feel very blessed to welcome Emily to our Harmony Theater family. Thanks for joining us Emily. We look forward to working with you.


